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### **Top Adult**

Combined total of points from all sections obtained by an individual.



### **Top Family**

Combined total of points from all members of the family. (Note: Family may consist of a minimum of two of the following - mother, father & children under 19 living at home)



### **Top Youth**

Combined total of points from all sections obtained by an individual Boy or Girl aged 18 & under.





# **Rules and Regulations**

- 1. FAIR DISTRICT The Fair is open to everyone and anyone.
- 2. This booklet will be used yearly, with a small supplement book inserted with year specific information in it. Please keep your copy in a handy place to refer to throughout the year as you create new items to enter each year.
- 3. ENTRY FEE The entry fee for each individual exhibit (for competition) shall be .50¢ for adult entries and .25¢ for youth entries. Youth entering into adult categories will pay .50¢ for those entries. There is no fee for "display only" exhibits.
- 4. ALL EXHIBITS must be delivered to the fair location and received by the fair committee members between 9:00 am and 3:00 pm on Saturday. Entry forms and exhibit cards must be completed, and exhibit cards must accompany the entries.
- 5. IN EVERY CLASS, the entry must never have been entered in a previous Ashcroft & District Fall Fair. All items for entry must be grown, raised or made by the exhibitor in whose name it is entered. Children are welcome to enter any adult categories.
- 6. ONLY ARTICLES LISTED in the entry book may be entered; however, each section has sufficient "Open Class" to allow for a large variety of entries. Please read the sections carefully for guidelines and qualifications.
- 7. IN EACH SECTION, THERE ARE LIMITS (usually one) to the number of entries allowed per competitor, per class. (Ex. You may enter D1, D2, D3, etc., but you cant enter 2 items in D1)
- 8. DISPLAY ONLY ITEMS will be accepted no entry fee will be charged. Entry forms and entry cards should be clearly marked "DISPLAY ONLY". Items for Display Only will not be judged. The owner's name may be displayed.
- 9. ONLY COMMITTEE MEMBERS or those duly appointed by them will be allowed to take, carry, distribute or arrange entries to the location of the exhibit tables. The committee may grant special permission to those who require setup time for their exhibit.
- 10. The Fall Fair reserves the right to make changes to the placement of an entry.
- 11. ONLY JUDGES AND AUTHORIZED OFFICIALS wearing proper identification tags will be allowed in the place of the exhibition while judging is in progress.
- 12. IN THE ABSENCE OF ANY COMPETITION in a section, the judges will award prizes only as they see fit. A single entry in any section does not necessarily guarantee a first, second or third place award. The judge's decision is final.
- 13. THE ASSOCIATION reserves the right to pro-rate prize lists:  $1^{st}$  \$3.00  $2^{nd}$  \$2.00  $3^{rd}$  \$1.00
- 14. EXHIBITS MUST BE REMOVED from the fair between 3:00 pm and 5:00 pm on <u>Sunday</u> <u>(Fair Day)</u>. Any person removing exhibits before the stated time, without the prior consent of the Executive, will forfeit all prizes and money.
- 15. PRIZE MONEY and prizes must be collected no later than 6:00 pm on Fair day, or they will be considered forfeited, unless notified of other arrangements. Prize money may be collected in the Fair Office between 2:00 and 5:00 pm.
- 16. AUCTION DONATIONS Any fruits, vegetables or other exhibits that exhibitors wish to donate for our auction will be gratefully received to help with expenses. Please specify on the entry form and exhibit card where indicated.
- 17. THE FAR ASSOCIATION is not responsible for any articles lost, damaged, or stolen.

- It should be packed attractively but fairly tightly so that food does not float.
- The liquid should be clear, free of cloudiness or sediment.
- The seal must be secure so there is no seepage.
